# 40 days OF SELF REFLECTION

## *24 Hours for the Lord*

Over the past few years, Pope Francis has designated a beautiful "moment" for the Lenten Season, in which particular attention is given to creating a special opportunity for penitence, prayer, and worship of our Lord in the Eucharist.

One such moment of grace will be, again this year, the "24 Hours for the Lord" initiative, which invites the entire Church community to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of Eucharistic Adoration. In 2018, inspired by the words of Psalm 130:4, "With you is forgiveness", this will take place from Friday, 9 March to Saturday, 10 March. In each Deanery, at least one church will remain open for twenty-four consecutive hours, offering an opportunity for both Eucharistic Adoration and Sacramental Confession. Please join us this week:

To comply with the policies and procedures set forth by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Kalamazoo Office of Safe Environment, the information below is run once per month in parish bulletins.

## Trauma Recovery Program

If you are a Catholic adult struggling with issues as a result of childhood abuse or neglect, the Trauma Recovery Program will give you specific skills for your healing process. The Trauma Recovery Program explains why the effects of childhood trauma go so deep and teaches skills for living more effectively in the present. This is done without rehashing the hurtful events of the past. The work is done in small groups facilitated by mental health professionals and a priest. The Program is a gift of the diocese at no cost to participants. ## Making a Report of Sexual Misconduct

A report of sexual misconduct can be initiated at the Diocese of Kalamazoo's Sexual Misconduct Question and Reporting Line: (877) 802-0115. This toll-free telephone number has been established as a part of the Diocese's effort to protect children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. This line is for reporting suspected sexual misconduct or child abuse within Diocesan institutions and ministries only. ## From the Office of Liturgy and Music

The third of the traditional minor orders in the Church is that of exorcist. This refers to a cleric who has been ordained into the minor order of exorcist, or a priest who has been mandated to perform the rite of solemn exorcism. Since at least the third century, the Latin Church has formally ordained men to the minor order of exorcist. These exorcists routinely performed (and priests even today still perform) ceremonies of minor exorcism over adults and infants preparing to be baptized through the imposition of hands, prayer and *exsufflation*, that is, breathing upon the candidate. As a minor order, exorcists wear the surplice. In 1972 the Vatican established a *ministry of exorcist* and abolished the minor order as a necessary step towards ordination into major orders. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* states that: "Jesus performed exorcisms and from him the Church has received the power and office of exorcizing" The revised 1983 *Code of Canon Law* states that the bishop is 'to give this permission only to a presbyter who has piety, knowledge, prudence, and integrity of life.' The latest English version of the Rite of Exorcism has recently been completed; while the older Rite used language of an assault on the powers of darkness, the newer version uses much softer language, as if exorcist and demon are to sit down and have a delightful conversation about the possibility of expulsion from the possessed.


